Richard T. McClintock, 98, of Lancaster, passed away Saturday, Aug. 7, 2004 at Rockmill Rehabilitation Center in Carroll. Richard was born March 18, 1906, to the late Charles W. and Sadie B. McClintock. He was a graduate of Lancaster High School in 1924 and joined the cost department of Anchor Hocking Corp. in 1925. Subsequently he became manager of cost control, director of corporate planning, was elected a vice president in 1961 and served as corporate vice president and comptroller for the corporation until his retirement in 1971.

He was a member of First United Methodist Church and was involved in many community organizations: United Way, Red Cross, Office of Price Administration, Selective Service Board, Chamber of Commerce and Lions Club. He was president of the Lancaster-

Fairfield County Library Board of Trustees in 1977 when the cornerstone of the present library building was laid. More recently he was a member of Ohio Senior Citizens, Olivedale Senior Center, the Heritage Society and the Fairfield County Vision Center.

He was preceded in death by his wife, Susie Alice McClintock, in 1991, and sisters Pauline Hutchinson in 1991 and Ruth Reed in 1996.

He is survived by his son and daughter-in-law, Richard W. and Virginia C. McClintock of Charlotte, N.C.; granddaughter, Anita M. and husband William "Mac" McLarin of Richmond, Va.; grandson, Richard W. McClintock Jr. and wife Margaret of Tampa, Fla.; five great-grandchildren, Sara Corinne Megan Elizabeth and Carter Alan McLarin of Richmond, Va.; Richard William III and Mae Chamblin McClintock of Tampa, Fla.; one sister, Betty Hedges of Lancaster; as well as nieces and nephews.

Funeral services will be held at 3 p.m. Monday at Halteman-Fett & Dyer Funeral Home with the Rev. Larry Brown officiating. Internment will follow in Forest Rose Cemetery. Friends may call from 1 to 3 p.m. Monday at the funeral home.

He had been a teacher for 31 year, coming here from Liberty Union where he taught from 1944-46, then at West and North Schools before being assigned to Thomas Ewing. He was a member of First Presbyterian Church where he was a former elder, president of the church's men's group and the Supper Club; chairman of the committee for the Presbyterian Boy Scouts; a member of the grange at Rushville; member of Masonic Bodies and Tarhe and Aladdin Shrine.
